A material is what something is made of. There are five basic materials and most things are made with them. The most frequent materials are: metal, glass, wood, plastic and cloth. There are some other materials, but they are not used as much as these five.

Let's talk about metal first. Metal is very heavy, and very hard and strong. It usually feels cool if you touch it. We use it to make lots of things. We use it for forks and knives, keys, and cars. It is used for these things because it is very strong.

The next one is glass. Glass is very smooth. It feels cool to touch. It is not as heavy as metal. It is hard, but it is not strong. It breaks very easily! Why do we use it then? We use it because it is clear! You can see through it! That's why it's used for windows and glasses.

Now, let's move on to wood. Wood is lighter than metal and glass. It is not as strong as metal, but it is much stronger than glass. We use it to make lots of things. Things made from wood are usually light and hard and strong. Chairs and tables are made from wood. Pencils are also made from wood.

Now let's talk about cloth. Cloth is very light, much lighter than wood, and it is very soft. We use it to make lots of things. For example, it is used to make clothing and blankets as well.

Last, let's mention plastic. It is also very light, but it is different from cloth. Sometimes it is soft and sometimes it is hard. Plastic can be used to make thin plastic bags. These are light, soft, and strong. It can also be used to make bicycle helmets. These are light, hard, and strong. A helmet and a bag seem completely different, but they are both made from plastic! Imagine that!
